This will be a small-ish group and one of the best rides of the season. Each rider will get more time on the bike that they choose, getting to know it well.

West Virginia is renowned for its amazing roads, friendly people, and incredible scenery; you will love this remote, undeveloped corner of The Mountain State. We will depart early on Friday morning and use tiny back roads to make our way south and west, following the Lost River to (hopefully) find Lost City and our log cabin, deep in the woods. The day's ride will cover 250+ miles.



On Sunday, you will have options. If you like, sleep in, and hang out around the cabin. There are remarkable hiking opportunities, as well as swimming. You could also take a short ride in any direction. Frankly, there are no bad roads: it's all good! If you're feeling ambitious, we could ride 100 miles for a close look at the Green Bank Radio Telescope, where the remote countryside insures little radio interference in the search for extra-terrestrial life.

We'll return to Kennett Square Sunday, after shooting through the Shanghai Gap and descending into a cave beneath a Civil War Battlefield. We hope for a hot, home-cooked meal by sundown. We'll be riding bikes chosen for their long-haul capabilities and comfort. This is serious riding, and a popular choice...ACT NOW!
