
**WHEREAS,** The Town Attorney has reviewed and approved the proposed grant funding.

**NOW, THEREFORE;**


**IT IS RESOLVED** by the Commissioners of the Town of Dewey Beach, Delaware that:

**COMPREHENSIVE PLAN  
FOR  
THE TOWN OF DEWEY BEACH  
SCOPE OF PROJECT**

**Phase I – Assessment, Evaluation and Education**

The University of Delaware Staff will review the Town's current procedures, Planning Commission, codes and ordinances. They will then have the Town Commissioners attend a training session on developing a Comprehensive Plan. Date of this session will be Thursday, September 23, 2004, at 10:30 a.m. at the Lifesaving Station.

**Phase II – Data Collection, Mapping and Plan Preparation**

The University of Delaware will collect background data and undertake planning studies to prepare maps and documents that will constitute a Draft Comprehensive Plan.

**Phase III – Education**

The University of Delaware will hold one (1) session with the public to engage citizens and property owners in the planning process. Information collected from citizen input will be incorporated into a Draft Comprehensive Plan. The plan will be posted for public distribution and meeting request.

**Phase IV – Adoption**

The University of Delaware will assist Dewey Beach in adopting the plan. This will include presenting plan documents at a public meeting, answering questions about the plan and providing advice.

## **Phase IV – Adoption (Cont'd)**

After the plan has been formally adopted by the Town and certified by the State, the University will produce twenty (20) copies of the plan for the Town and post on the IPA's website.
