Meeting was called to order at 6:01pm

Public Comment/Open Forum-Alex began the discussion with the choices we have for the Christmas Parade and alternatives for this year due to the COVID-19 virus and to try to do something that is in the best interest for Seymour and its residents. Rather than postpone the parade, it was suggested we look into the alternative idea of having a first annual town wide house decorating contest for this year and hopefully have the parade again next year and possibly have the house decorating contest next year under the auspices of the town. Funds would be requested from the town to hold the contest and would also include decorating the Town Hall. Decorations would be put up by the Public Works Department. Alex suggested the Parade chairman would help with the judging. Harvey Catlin suggested an art teacher from the Seymour School system could be the judge. Signs would be put on the lawns of the winning houses. Participating houses will have signs with a theme on them as well as a ticket number.

Registration would begin on November 5, 2020 and applications would be taken until December 5, 2020. The deadline would be 5 pm on December 5, 2020.

Judging would take place starting on December 6 and possibly continuing until December 7 or 8 depending on the number of entries. Prizes would be \$200 for first prize, \$100 for second prize, \$75 for third prize, and an award for fourth place. The award could be a name such as the Grinch Award, Clark Griswold Award, or Martha Stewart Award. The first 15 people to register would get a \$15 Dunkin Donuts Certificate.

Some of the guidelines for the decorations would be that they be on the outside of the house only, lights should be on the days that they are being judged. They will be judged based on curb appeal. (How they appear from the road), uniqueness of the design. The winners will be announced at the Board of Selectman meeting on December 16.

Fred Stanek made a motion to dub the event the Christmas Lights of Seymour. Harvey Catlin seconded the motion with the addition of making it the Holiday Lights of Seymour to be more inclusive.

A completed proposal will be made at the next meeting which will be on Monday November 2, 2020 at 6 pm.
