

The following summary of legislation passed by Dover City Council at its regular meeting the 14<sup>th</sup> day of May 2018 is published once to comply with the Ohio Revised Code. A full copy of the text can be obtained or viewed at the Office of the Mayor of the City of Dover. Emergency resolution 4-18. An emergency resolution authorizing and approving of the distribution of bed tax money in the amount of \$5,000.00 to the Dover Lions Club pursuant to the application submitted to and approved by the Dover ARB Board and Dover City Council and DCO Chapter 182. Emergency ordinance 22-18. An emergency ordinance authorizing the City of Dover participation in the ODOT winter contract (018-19) for road salt. Emergency ordinance 25-18. An emergency ordinance authorizing the Director of Public Service or his designee to apply for the 2018 Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) grant cycle of the transportation alternatives program (TAP) for the second phase of improvements as authorized in ordinance 21-18 and as referenced in this ordinance. The Clerk of Council will supply a copy of the complete text with a written request and payment of a fee of .10 cents per page.

An emergency resolution authorizing and approving of the distribution of bed tax money in the amount of \$5,000.00 for the Historic Canal Dover Association pursuant to the application submitted to and approved by the Dover ARB Board and Dover City Council and DCO Chapter 182. Emergency ordinance 24-18. An emergency ordinance authorizing the Dover Service Director to sell by advertisement and receipt of sealed bids, or by internet auction, or by sale through approved governmental auction sites, or the Police Auction, surplus equipment or vehicles no longer needed by the City of Dover. In the event that attempts at sale are unsuccessful or do not acquire as significant funds as is likely through a sale by scrap, the vehicles and equipment may be sold as scrap. The vehicles and equipment are on file with the Service Director. The Clerk of Council will supply a copy of the complete text with a written request and payment of a fee of .10 cents per page.
