Ferguson Township ABC Email Policy

Dave Modricker, Public Works Director will provide an overview of the Township email policy for Authorities, Boards and Commissions. A copy of this policy is part of the agenda.

Tree Removal and Replacement Proposals

The arborist has prepared maps and lists for 2017 tree removals and their replacements after the FTTC tree tour in July. The FTTC should recommend edits as necessary before letters are sent to the affected property owners for the Public Hearing in October.

Haymarket Park Drainage Channel Planting

The Ferguson Township Board of Supervisors has asked the FTTC to produce a riparian buffer planting plan for a rock lined drainage channel in Haymarket Park. The arborist will provide photos and an aerial view of the area along with a first draft planting plan. The FTTC should review these items and recommend changes as needed.

Mulch Volcanos

The FTTC has shown interest in providing more outreach efforts to residents in regards to mulch volcanos. Recently the arborist has prepared a fact sheet that was distributed in the Township e-newsletter, and promoted on twitter. The FTTC should recommend further outreach efforts as needed.

Nuisance Section of Tree Ordinance

The FTTC requested a discussion on the section of the tree ordinance regarding nuisance by disease or pest on private property. That section of the ordinance is included in the agenda packet and the FTTC should discuss how to handle this issues in the future.

Arborist report:

The Arborist will review work activities and plan reviews since the last meeting.

Communications to Commission Members

This is an opportunity for FTTC members to report on any contact by residents regarding FTTC matters.

I. ATTENDANCE

The Tree Commission held its regular meeting on Monday, June 19, 2017 at the Ferguson Township Municipal Building. In attendance were:

II. CALL TO ORDER

Mr. Fescemyer called the Monday, June 19, 2017 Ferguson Township Tree Commission meeting to order at 5:33 pm.

III. APPROVAL OF May 15th MEETING MINUTES

Ms. Chivers made a motion to approve the minutes with amendment from the May 15, 2017 meeting. Mr. Learn seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

IV. RESIDENT REQUESTED TREE REMOVAL

Annie Doncsecz attended the Ferguson Township Tree Commission (FTTC) meeting to request the removal of two crab apple trees along the front of her property on Cherry Ridge Road which are infected with apple scab. Mr. Fescemyer stated that along that road there are only four street trees including these two. Mr. King told the FTTC that crab apple trees do have a shorter life span than oak trees and are prone to disease such as apple scab. Ms. Doncsecz has tried to treat the trees for apple scab but it has not helped. Ms. Doncsecz would like to have the trees replaced with another species. Mr. Fescemyer said that he would like to see the trees replaced by the Township so the resident does not spend personal money to treat Township street trees. Mr. King said that the replacement trees would be added to the spring contract in 2018 and would send the approved tree listing to Ms. Doncsecz.

V. THE HEIGHTS TREE REMOVAL

Mr. King told the FTTC that Yonder Mountain Conservation on behalf of The Heights has requested the removal of a small shingle oak on Northwick Blvd. Mr. King said that the oak tree would be flagged this summer for removal and replanted in the spring. The Heights would like the tree removed sooner than fall. Mr. Learn raised concerns about the oak tree stump contracting oak wilt disease if removed during this time of the year. The FTTC were in agreement that since the tree is isolated and is going to be removed that there is little chance of contracting the disease.

VI. 2017 PRUNING CONTRACT

Mr. King showed the FTTC a GIS map that divided the Township into seven pruning blocks. The tree inventory was used to show tree locations. Mr. King showed the areas that need to be pruned and the areas that do not have Township trees. Mr. King indicated the need to or desire to ground truth the latest inventory. It was also mentioned that residents need to be aware of the distinction between trees in the right of way and private property trees close to the right of way. This year trees in Teaberry Ridge, Chestnut Ridge Manor and Sunday Drive are scheduled to be pruned. The blocks are based on number of trees and location. 750 trees are scheduled to be pruned this year. Mr. Modricker and the FTTC discussed the feasibility of Mr. King and an intern updating the tree inventory in lieu of contracting the work every 5 years.

VII. OUTREACH AND EDUCATION

Ms. Chivers asked for deadlines for the upcoming e-newsletters. Mr. King wrote the article for the June newsletter. Ms. Chivers suggested two topics for future articles: mulch volcanos and the apprehension regarding the planting of oak trees due to oak wilt.

VIII. ARBORIST REPORT

Mr. King updated the FTTC on his activities inspecting newly planted trees in three subdivision phases. In the Hunter's Chase subdivision there are locations where the trees planted do not meet the approved planting plan. The species of trees are not necessarily an issue to Mr. King. Mr. Modricker will follow up on the best course of action.

The oak wilt treatment contract has been completed pending any new cases. Annie Doncsecz who attended the meeting to discuss her tree removal request told Mr. King during the meeting that another property near her's on Cherry Ridge Road may have a tree that is showing symptoms of oak wilt. Mr. King will contact the owner of the property and take samples to determine whether or not the tree has contracted oak wilt.

A contractor contacted Mr. King about a resident that would like to have dead wood removed from an oak tree. Mr. King conducted a site visit and is not willing to issue a tree permit to remove branches since oak trees are not permitted to be pruned during this time of year. Mr. King did not find the tree branches to be hazardous. The contractor has been made aware that if pruning does occur that there are fines that will be assessed.

Mr. King was involved with the Seedlings for Schools program at Wonderland Charter School a few weeks ago. Columbia Gas reached out to Mr. King to speak at this event to help educate students regarding the importance of caring for trees in the community. Barbra McDill asked Mr. King to speak at a Master Garden educational event in August but he had to decline due to a previous engagement. Mr. King is also working on the operating budget for 2018 as well as the listing of tree removals for this coming year.

IX. COMMUNICATIONS TO COMMISSION MEMBERS

Ms. Chivers asked Mr. King about the width of the right of way on Sunday Drive and Nixon Road. There is a pin oak up on the bank that looks to have a lot of dead wood. Mr. King will look at the tree while reviewing the areas for tree removals.

X. FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS

Ms. Chivers suggested that the FTTC discuss the Nuisance by Pest or Disease section of the street tree ordinance at the August meeting. Additional planting locations as well as removals will also be discussed at August's meeting. Some suggestions that have already been made are along bike paths, Cambridge Drive, West Park Hills Ave, Science Park Rd, Farmstead Ln/Homestead side, Greenleaf Manor, Bristol/Saratoga/Autumnwood Dr, North Cherry Hill, Whitehall Rd between College Ave and Fieldstone, and Deepwood Dr. Mr. Learn asked what the right of way situation is like between the farmers ag fields and Whitehall Rd. Mr. King said that Mr. Modricker would be best to answer any questions regarding planting trees in the right of way adjacent to agricultural fields.

XI. ADJOURNMENT

With no further business, the June 19, 2017 Tree Commission regular meeting was adjourned at 7:09 pm.

II. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting began around 5:00 pm Monday July 17, 2017.

III. APPROVAL OF JUNE 19th MEETING MINUTES

The meeting minutes of the June 19th 2017 meeting will be reviewed at the next meeting.

IV. INSPECTION OF TREE REMOVAL SITES/AFFECTED OAK WILT TREES

The group departed to visit the following proposed tree removal and planting locations and the affected oak wilt trees:

Shellers Bend/Blue Course Drive/Butz St/West Beaver Ave/Westerly Parkway- Mr. King reminded the Ferguson Township Tree Commission (FTTC) that a few of these trees, especially one on West Beaver, are trees that the FTTC were shown the previous year and attempts that were made to save the trees have failed. The FTTC are in agreement that the trees that Mr. King marked for removal do need to be removed and new trees should be planted.

Ridge Master Dr/Sowards Pl/Teaberry Ln/Martin St- Mr. King showed the FTTC the trees that he marked for removal and the FTTC are in agreement that the proposed trees be removed and replaced with new trees.

Prestwick Blvd/Northwick Blvd/Havershire Blvd/Old Gatesburg Rd- Mr. King showed the FTTC the trees that he has marked for removal and the FTTC are in agreement that the proposed trees be removed and replaced.

Cherry Ridge Road/Farmstead Ln/Tanager Dr/Linnet Ln/Partridge Ln – Mr. King showed the FTTC the affected oak wilt trees in Park Forest. The FTTC members have expressed concern regarding the amount of oak trees surrounding the affected oak trees and how if left untreated that the disease could easily spread. Mr. King said that he will continue to monitor the affected trees and respond accordingly to any new concerns regarding suspected new cases.

Charleston Dr/Pine Cliff Rd/Autumnwood Dr/Meadowhawk Ln/Harvest Run Rd S- Mr. King showed the FTTC the trees he marked for removal and the FTTC is in agreement that the proposed trees be removed and replaced with new trees.

Circleville Road/Longfellow Ln/N Foxpointe Dr/Northampton St/Barnstable Ln/Sagamore Dr- Mr. King showed the FTTC the trees he marked for removal and the FTTC are in agreement with the majority of the proposed removals. Mr. King said that the three trees along Circleville Road that need to be removed will not be replaced with new trees. The three trees are in a heavily wooded area. The FTTC would like the trees that Mr. King marked for removal along Longfellow Lane and Northampton Street to be pruned only and not removed. These trees will be kept for another year and reviewed next year.

S Nixon Rd/Lois Ln- Mr. King showed the FTTC the trees he marked for removal and the FTTC are in agreement that the proposed trees be removed and replaced with new trees. The FTTC members also noted in this area a large amount of mulch volcanos. The FTTC would like discuss at the next tree commission meeting a way of making the community aware of the problems that mulch volcanos can cause.

V. ADJOURNMENT

With no further business, the July 17, 2017 Tree Commission regular meeting was adjourned at 8:00 pm.

WHEREAS, it is recognized that email is a vital communication tool for many of the Township's Authorities, Boards, and Commissions; and


WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors recognizes that it is important for holders of Township email accounts to abide by certain standards of conduct and to be compliant with governing local, state, and federal statutes; and

WHEREAS, the Ferguson Township Email Utilization Policy for Authorities, Boards, and Commissions is attached hereto as Exhibit "A".

NOW THEREFORE the Ferguson Township Board of Supervisors adopts the Ferguson Township Email Utilization Policy for Authorities, Boards, and Commissions.

Exhibit "A"

Ferguson Township Email Utilization Policy

Purpose

This policy applies to all elected and appointed officials of Ferguson Township to which Ferguson Township email addresses are issued including, but which may not be limited to, the Board of Supervisors, Planning Commission, Tree Commission, and Zoning Hearing Board, hereafter referred to as "ABCs." The purpose of this policy is to establish expectations of conduct by which email users shall abide when utilizing Township email accounts, as well as to ensure compliance with governing statutes including the PA Sunshine Act, PA Right to Know Law, and other applicable local, state, and federal law.

Policy

It is recognized that email is an important form of business communication for the Township's ABCs. All communications sent from or received by Township email accounts should be presumed to be Township property, subject to discovery, retention and disposition under applicable statute. All communications should be professional in nature. The use of Township email accounts for defamatory, obscene, sexually explicit, illegal, offensive, threatening or other inappropriate communications is strictly prohibited.

It shall be incumbent upon the Township ABC member to regularly check their Township email account for agendas and other communications relative to their position on an ABC. Ferguson Township staff shall not send duplicate emails to Township ABC members' personal email accounts.

Usage

All business relative to the Township's ABCs shall be done on Township email accounts. ABC members shall refrain from conducting Township business from any personal email account. Furthermore, ABC members are prohibited from configuring Township email accounts to automatically forward received messages to personal email accounts. Synchronizing a Township email account with the email application of a personal device or smartphone is generally permitted. Township email accounts shall always be presumed to be subject to public review under the Pennsylvania Right to Know Law.

Applicability of The Pennsylvania Sunshine Act

It is recognized that any prearranged gathering of an agency which is attended or participated in by a quorum of the members of an agency held for the purpose of deliberating agency business or taking official action must be done with prior notice and provide an opportunity for the public to attend, participate, and comment before any official action is taken. Furthermore, it is recognized that the engagement of deliberation of agency business or taking official action by email constitutes a meeting under the definition provided in the PA Sunshine Act. Finally, because it is not possible for such meetings by email to be compliant with the provisions of the PA Sunshine Act, such interactions must be avoided.

Applicability of the Pennsylvania Right to Know Law

It is recognized that all ABC emails which contain information that is a matter of public record as defined by the Pennsylvania Right to Know Law could be subject to discovery under said law and subpoena by a court of law. A policy shall be applied to all ABC email accounts which automatically purges all sent email after a period of ninety (90) days. In any event in which a Right to Know request is approved by the

Township's Right to Know Officers that would require the discovery of ABC emails, the Township Right to Know Officer shall provide applicable ABC members with notice. The Township's email system is configured in a manner that all sent and received emails can be retrieved by the Township's designated Information Technology Administrator.

Applicability of Other Established Policies

In addition to governing statute, Township email accounts shall also be subject to regulation by other established policy, such as the Board of Supervisors Procedures Manual, Ferguson Township Administrative Code, and other covenants and regulations applicable to Township ABCs.

Training

Township staff shall provide this policy and training to all members of Township ABCs on the proper handling and utilization of email. Questions on this policy or handling of Township email shall be directed to the appropriate staff liaison of the ABC. The following are examples of emails that generally constitute public records:

- Email created or received by municipal employees in connection with municipal business;
- Email that facilitates action, such as initiating, authorizing, or completing a transaction in connection with municipal business.

The following are examples of emails that generally do not constitute public records:

- Personal email messages and announcements not related to municipal; business;
- Copies or extracts of documents emailed for convenience or reference;
- Internal emails created by employees on work-related topics which do not facilitate action;
- Emails containing drafts, notes, or inter-office memoranda that are not retained by the municipality in the ordinary course of business.

Limited Personal Use Permitted

Personal use is permissible within reasonable limits and if consistent with restrictions defined in this policy. Examples of permissible personal use of Township email accounts includes, but may not necessarily be limited to scheduling of appointments; communications relative to social events such as retirement functions, birthdays, notice of community events to be provided as information or invitation to other Township email account holders; and other limited uses that do not interfere with the ABC members' responsibilities or conflict with other provisions of this policy.

No Expectation of Privacy

It is recognized that, since all Township email is considered property of the Township, the Township Manager or his/her designee may monitor these communications compliance with this policy and to protect the Township from liability. There is no expectation of privacy of emails sent from a Township email account.

Permanency of Communications

Deleting email messages does not guarantee that they are erased from the email system. ABC members should not believe that privacy of email messages is created by deleting incoming or outgoing messages.

In addition, in the event of litigation or court subpoena, technology may exist to restore deleted email. ABC members should be prepared to defend in court and under oath the content of anything communicated in an email.

No Harassment

No email messages should be created or sent which might constitute intimidating, hostile or offensive material on the basis of sex, race, color, religion, national origin, age, sexual orientation, or disability. Harassment is broadly defined as anything that has improper (e.g. sexual) content and is both unwelcome and offensive to a reasonable person. The display of any kind of sexually explicit image or document in the Township's email system is prohibited. In addition, sexually explicit material may not be archived, stored, or distributed via Township email accounts. Please refer to the Township's policy against sexual harassment in the Ferguson Township Personnel Manual for further description.

Consequences of Misuse

Any violation of this policy may constitute the forfeiture of a user's access to a Township email account. Further civil or criminal liability as may be necessary and justified under applicable statute may also apply.

Waiver

Township ABC members assigned access to a Township email account agree to sign an acknowledgement that states the member understands and shall abide by this policy. This acknowledgement establishes that the ABC member understands that the communications covered by this policy are subject to review to determine compliance with this policy.

(C) Nuisance by disease and or pests: Abatement measures to protect the public.

In any instance which in the professional judgment of the Public Works Director or Township Arborist, trees located on public property have the appearance of being infested by pests, such as emerald ash borer or other nuisance-type pests, or has the appearance of being infected by Dutch elm disease, elm yellows disease, oak wilt or any other infectious disease, as such terms

are known and used by and among Certified Arborists, the Public Works Director, Township Arborist or his agent shall inspect the condition of such trees. If upon such inspection any tree is found to harbor any such pest or infectious disease as referenced above the Public Works Director shall be authorized to declare the trees, or any part thereof, to be a nuisance and through the Department of Public Works, order the removal, pruning, treatment or abatement of the trees, or part thereof, within such period of time deemed appropriate by the Public Works Director.

For trees on private property within the Regional Growth Boundary for the Township, in any instance which in the professional judgment of the Public Works Director, trees located on private property have the appearance of being infested by pests, such as emerald ash borer or other nuisance-type pests, or has the appearance of being infected by Dutch elm disease, elm yellows disease, oak wilt or any other infectious disease, as such terms are known and used by and among Certified Arborists, the Public Works Director or his agent shall inspect the condition of such trees. If upon such inspection any tree is found to harbor any such pest or infectious disease as referenced above the Tree Commission may require the removal, pruning or treatment of trees. If within thirty days after the date of notice by certified mail, return receipt requested, to remove, prune or treat trees, the property owner has not complied with that order, the Public Works Director shall be authorized to declare the trees, or any part thereof, to be a nuisance and through the Department of Public Works, order the removal, pruning, treatment or abatement of the trees, or part thereof. The cost of cutting and removal of trees by the Township shall be charged to the property owner. The charge shall be a lien against the real estate of the property owner and shall be collected in the same manner as other municipal liens. Further penalties for violations of this subsection shall be those provided in section 10.00(A).
