GRAND RE-OPENING

The Milford Museum recently re-opened after a twelve week "face lift" closure. The Museum is housed in Milford's original 1910 post office building. The structure is owned by the State's Division of Historical and Cultural Affairs, and operated as a Commission of the City of Milford. State historic restoration money was used to build a new handicapped access ramp, resurface the parking lot, fix the roof leaks, and upgrade the security and fire systems.

Museum staff used this opportunity to repaint interior galleries, improve signage, and change exhibits. Additional items were moved from storage to display cases.

NOTE: Museum hours have expanded in order to fulfill DelDot requirements for highway signage.
