George Black home at 1007 S.E. Front Street. The front section dates to 1782 and has one of the earliest intact post & beam frameworks. Home to early Marshall Mill owners.



Causey Springs Gazebo, circa 1880, was a gathering spot for early Milfordians before 1900. The structure sat at the northeast corner of Church and Causey Avenues (site of a convenience store today). Moved to Causey property in 1903 and became part of Eleanor Vinyard Washburn's first garage in 1936. Owned today by John & Aldon James, sons of the late Dr. O.A. James, Milford surgeon.

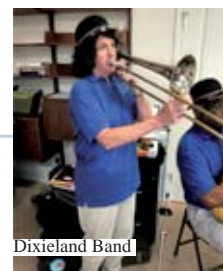

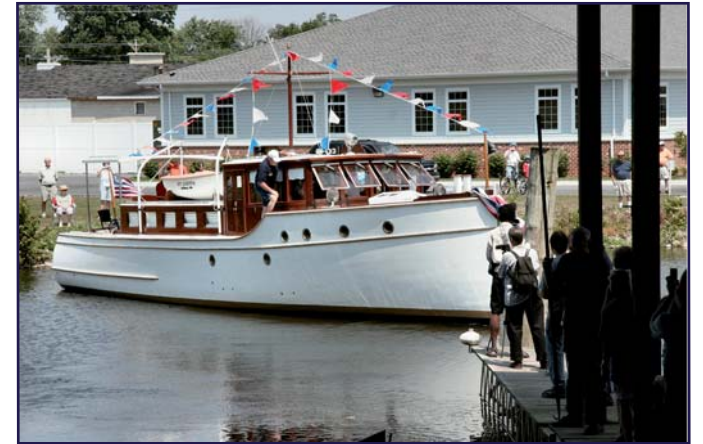
Augusta Rechristened at Vinyard's

The restored 50' cruising yacht *Augusta* slid down the launch ways at Vinyard shipyard in Milford on June 12, 2010 cheered by 350 well-wishers. The first Vinyard pleasure yacht built in 1927 was recovered from neglect in Virginia after 83 years on Chesapeake Bay and painstakingly repaired and upgraded over the past nine months for another life as a modern pleasure yacht.

Sudler & Joan Lofland partnered with the Milford Museum to host the admiring crowd for a cocktail fundraising event to benefit the Museum. The Loflands purchased the dormant shipyard in 1996, brought it back to life as a home for wooden boats and recovered much of its lost history, including three Vinyard-built yachts, since its founding by Wilson M. Vinyard in 1896.

The Milford Community Band played nautical scores as Sudler Lofland recounted historical events that coincided with the original launch ceremony in 1927. The *Augusta* slid into the Mispillion river on time at 11:00 a.m. "high-tide" for the Saturday launch. The Max Pasano family from Baltimore, owners of the yacht for 30 years of its life on Chesapeake Bay, witnessed the restored yacht prepare for a new life of luxury.

Marilyn Wittington & Eric Rau from Delaware Humanities Forum, Randy Goss & Tom Summers from Delaware State Archives, Mayor Ronnie Rogers and many dignitaries joined well-wishers for a cocktail-luncheon party hosted by the Loflands. Nearly \$10,000 was raised from donations for Museum capital projects. Major contributors Tom Draper, Elmer Fannin and Dave Burton attended the historic launch of the *Augusta*.
