2019 Business/Rental License Renewals

Business/Rental License Renewals will be mailed in December. In order to renew a business license, the applicant must be current on all Town obligations. The Town of Georgetown has a "Clean Hands Ordinance", §89-2, that requires applicants to be current on all of their obligations (such as, but not limited to, taxes and utilities) owed to the Town prior to receiving any approvals, permits, licenses (renewals), and/or the use, receipt, or provision of Town services.

TRICK OR TREATING IN GEORGETOWN OCTOBER 31ST 6:00 P.M.—8:00 P.M.

- Parents should walk with their children when trick-or-treating and stick to familiar neighborhoods. Do not let them go alone! Teach children never to go into strangers homes or cars.
- In case young children become lost, put a nametag with two phone numbers on their costumes.
- Choose light-colored costumes that are labeled "flame-retardant," meaning the material will not burn. Add reflective tape to costumes and trick-or-treat bags.
- Walk on well-lit sidewalks and driveways with flashlights. Use crosswalks and never assume that vehicles will stop for pedestrians. Insist that trick-or-treaters walk, not run or ride bicycles at night.
- Throw away treats that are unsealed, have holes in the packages, are spoiled, or are home-made treats that were not made by someone you know.
