Getting through meals, dressing and bathing, and simply enjoying play time can be more challenging than for families of typically developing children. Similarly, families who are in crisis may also struggle to get into a schedule of regular routines. When coping with the added concerns of supporting a family or dealing with mental health issues, families may need extra support in establishing routines that work for them and help each day get a little easier. This session will discuss how the Routines-Based Interview and Interventions support diverse families. Building on what a family needs and wants for their daily lives, this approach fits with the Family Partnership Agreement as a strategy to understand and simplify families' lives, regardless of whether they are related to an infant or toddler with a disability. Participants will experience hands-on activities to demonstrate how to interview, support, and integrate these practices into their classroom lessons, family child care routines, socialization activities, home visits, and family meetings.
