RECENT BOARD OF SUPERVISORS ACTIONS

November 5, 2014

- Advertise for a Certified Public Accountant or firm, to audit the Township accounts for fiscal year 2014, was approved.
- Advertise the Annual Township Budgets for fiscal year 2015, was approved.
- The proposal from A.J. Jurich, Inc., for improvements to the Mill Creek Pump Station, at a cost of \$11,000.00, was approved.
- The Board of Supervisors held a public hearing on November 5, 2014 for the adoption of Proposed Ordinance No. 3 of 2014 "An ordinance amending the Thornbury Township Zoning Code, Chapter 27, as amended, to amend Article 12, residential cluster design, Subsection 1205(7) to specify location and setbacks for swimming pools and to amend Article 21, General Regulations, Section 27-2113 to clarify the general location and setback requirements for residential swimming pools."

November 19, 2014

- Resolution 2014-10, conditionally approving the Megill 352 - Inter-municipal.
- Final Minor Subdivision located at 1901 Middletown Road was approved.
- Authorizing the Township Manager to execute the DELCORA Agreement for Operation & Maintenance of the Wastewater Treatment Plant and Pump Stations, based upon review of revisions requested, was approved.
- The proposal from Haws Masonry for stabilization of Section One of the Frazer Ruins at a cost of \$8,931.00, was approved.

December 3, 2014

- A donation of \$200.00 each, toward the Delaware County Historical Society, for their passport to History Program, the Colonial Pennsylvania Plantation Farm for their Animal Fund, and the Chester County Historical Society, for their Passmore Williamson book restoration fund, for a total of \$600.00 was approved.
- Resolution 2014-12, designating and defining the new WSSD-3 Sewer District, was approved.

Environmental Advisory Committee

EAC Events

March 28, 2015: The Luckenbach Trail

We will clear away any winter damage such as fallen trees or branches and make sure all trail markings are in good shape. As the trail nears the village of Cheyney, it passes the newly acquired Township Open Space on Station Road. We plan to link the trail to the open space.

April 25, 2015: Annual Stream Cleaning

In conjunction with the Chester-Ridley-Crum (CRC) Watershed Association, the EAC and volunteers remove any trash or obstructions along the 4 miles of stream in our township. Following the Stream Cleaning event, participants are invited to a picnic at noon, usually at the Ridley Creek State Park.

May 9, 2015: Patterson Ridge Access and Summit Loop Trails

We plan trail improvement, marking restoration and possible minor trail rerouting to provide a good wilderness experience. This trail has incredible views.

June 6, 2015: Historic Hike and Picnic

Help us combine some of Thornbury's history with a fun picnic in Bonner Park at the Frazier Ruin's picnic area. A local historian will join us at the Locksley Rd Crossing. It is possible to take a short version from Rose Lane more directly to the Frazer Ruins.

For more details contact Larry Barrett (610.459.3231) We will meet at Cheyney RR Station (the Post Office) on Cheyney Road at 9am and proceed to the respective sites unless otherwise specified.

New EAC Member Please join us as we welcome our newest member, Rhona Klein. Ms. Klein brings with her years of experience, great energy and a love of the environment.

Barrett's Meadow Penn DOT has not approved final plans yet, however they did include our request for a trail through the area after construction as well as a

connecting trail to the proposed trail system at the Station Road Bridge.

GIS Update The Environmental Advisory Council (EAC) has been using the Geographical Information System (GIS) of the World-Wide Firm ESRI since its inception. It has been valuable in establishing our trail system and accurately documenting Township locational details such as environmental features, roads, boundaries and points of interest. The Township has been working towards an upgrade of our capabilities as the present computer is outdated and access by EAC members is also difficult. EAC's own GIS specialist, Allen McCann, has created many layers of GIS overlays to township maps and aerial photos designating trail locations and other features. Although Allen is retiring from the EAC he is continuing with the Planning Committee and we hope to coordinate on joint ventures with the new system. *T*

Updates from the Sewer Committee

The sewer construction on Highpoint, Dilworthtown Rd. and Fox Lair referred to as WSSD-3 is complete. Many residents have chosen the E/One Grinder pump. A service plan is advised. While E/One advertises that their systems are maintenance free, it is important to understand that they are mechanical systems and issues can arise. According to E/One's website, the best way to handle power outages is using an alarm panel that is equipped with a Remote Sentry Module and a generator receptacle, if one is available. The Remote Sentry is a remote alarm with a buzzer and LED that indicates a high water alarm even if the power is out.

Hopefully we won't experience any power outages but; if we do, please be sure to limit your water usage as much as possible. The storage capacity is only adequate for the short term. The change in seasons is always a great time to perform maintenance and inspections of your sewer and septic systems. When septic systems are properly maintained, they effectively reduce if not, eliminate most human health or environmental threats posed by pollutants in household wastewater. The Sewer Committee encourages any township resident interested in bringing public sewers to their area come out and attend the next scheduled Sewer Committee meeting. *T*

Please Note:

Public Sewer Fee Increase

Please note that the sewer rental fee beginning with your sewer bill that you will receive in mid-April will increase to \$135.00 per quarter. This additional \$5.00 represents a 3.8% increase, which is the first since 2011. We regret any inconvenience this may cause, but have determined it necessary to maintain the integrity of our infrastructure and process your wastewater. 





Hallowed ground...you don't know what you have till it's gone

Our commission is involved in protecting our historic resources and educating the public of our areas history. Ground is a piece of history we all most likely, take for granted. Years ago, the Brandywine Battlefield Task Force of the Chester County Planning Department, together with the Delaware County Planning Commission, formed Committees to discuss protecting, preserving and educating the public—you—of the significance of our resources. These committees have evolved since their inception and are generally comprised of members of the Historical Commissions of the 15 townships around us. These townships contain the battle routes and battle sites of the Battle of Brandywine. In other words, they contain... hallowed ground.

What does hallowed ground have to do with this?

How often have you viewed an open piece of ground, you looked at it for years... and then it's swallowed up with houses. Ever think what might have happened on that ground and how preservation of the site might be more important than a development? How would you go about trying to preserve it?

In 2014, as quoted from The Civil War Trust Organization “Congress reauthorized a highly successful federal matching grant program for preservation of Civil War Battlefields. In addition, the bill expands that existing program to provide grants for acquisition of land at Revolutionary War and War of 1812 battlefields.” Go to www.campaign1776.org for more information.
