

Township Manager Letter

Hello fellow residents. Hopefully the change of seasons finds you in good health and spirits. I wanted to share information that will hopefully clear up some issues or misconceptions. Many residents are under the impression that it is someone else's responsibility to maintain the trees and shrubs in the right-of-way. Widespread power outages that occur after storms like the nor'easters we experienced in March and the high wind events in April were in large part due to downed trees and branches. All of those fallen trees belong to someone, and it is not the utility company or the department of transportation, they belong to us, the homeowners. We are all inconvenienced when we lose power, cable TV, and

internet access, but few of us are taking the steps necessary to avoid these untimely outages. Hiring someone to remove branches or trim vegetation that may threaten utility lines is a great start to help everyone make it through the poorest of weather conditions without incident. The Township makes efforts to keep our residents informed and safe during significant weather events. Please do your part. If road closure signs are up, and caution tape is in the roadway, please do not travel through that area. We see it happen all too often, and it is dangerous. *T*



It is with great sadness that we inform you of the passing of our Building Inspector, Tim Durham, of Chili's Inspection Services, on March 27, 2018. Tim earned his Masters Degree in Engineering from Drexel University, and then realized he was just not interested in sitting at a desk every day, so he pursued a career as a building inspector. Tim worked for many of our neighboring townships in addition to Thornbury. Despite his love of the Dallas Cowboys, he fit in very well at Thornbury Township, and we tried not to hold it against him! He was a sensible and approachable inspector, something our residents definitely appreciated. Tim was considerate of our residents and gave them practical advice on their home projects. He served on several boards and coached football for years in his hometown of Pennsville, NJ. Tim is definitely missed here at the Township, and we send our condolences to his wife and children.

Peddling/Solicitation Ordinance

At the April meeting the members discussed the pros and cons of exempted organizations, restrictions, penalties, enforcement and recommended adoption of the draft ordinance, with various conditions for the Board of Supervisors to consider.

Looking at our Historic Resource Properties (HRP's)

To date, 12 of the 204 studies are complete. Our Board of Supervisors approved three more for 2018. The three chosen were standing during the day of the Battle of Brandywine on September 11, 1777. All played a part in helping to secure America's independence from England. These properties were either subject to raids by the Redcoats or were part of George Washington's Strategic Retreat. Our goal on these studies is to share our Township's history with you and not have the facts of these properties just sit on paper in some file somewhere. Thornbury had many important founders of this country live here, work here, fight here or pass thru. Our little Township was a key component to making America what it is today. There is a story behind every property and the histories these

studies produce are fascinating. We would like you to be able to look at a piece of ground or a building and know its historical relevance. Do you know where in our Township the Lenni Lenape Indians lived...taking game from our forests and fish from our streams? Are you aware that William Penn gave his son and his daughter, each, a hunting cabin along with the surrounding acreage and that both of those cabins are extant and one is in our Township? Does it mean anything that our Township served as one of the primary retreat routes through which George Washington ordered his Army to travel, thus securing they could fight another day...and win. The Thornbury Historical Society and our Historical Commission are partnering to complete two HRP studies of the Station Road area, per year. Stay tuned! *TF*
