

John Fund

Author, Columnist, and Senior Editor

John Fund is currently a columnist for National Review Online and Senior Editor at *The American Spectator*. He is a frequent guest on C-Span, Fox News, the Wall Street Journal, and other media outlets. His insight is sought after on national issues such as immigration, voter fraud,

and the Kavanaugh and Ford controversy.

John Fund started his career in 1984 with The Wall Street Journal and worked with them for over two decades. He began as a deputy editorial features editor. Then in 1986, he became an editorial page writer that specialized in politics and government. From 1994-2001 he was a member of the Journal's editorial board. Fund contributed to their opinion page with his column "On The Trail" from 2000-2011 in addition to their newsletter *Political Diary*.

Since he started his career he has also written for *Esquire*, *Reader's Digest*, *Reason*, and *The New Republic*. In 1992 he co-wrote the book *Cleaning House: America's Campaign for Term Limits* with James Coyne. That same year John Fund collaborated with Rush Limbaugh's book *The Way Things Ought to Be* by transcribing it from tape and editing it. In 2004 Fund wrote his book, *Stealing Elections: How Voter Fraud Threatens Our Democracy*. In 2012 Fund and Hans von Spakovsky wrote *Who's Counting?: How Fraudsters and Bureaucrats Put Your Vote at Risk*. It argues that voter fraud has been a well-documented issue in the United States and that it continues to be a significant problem today.
